#### Meet the teachers and Headspace Parent Seminar

I thank all the parents/carers who attended the Meet the Teachers afternoon and also thank those who remained for the Headspace Parent Seminar.

Feedback has been very positive and to ensure that parents/carers who were not able to attend have access to the information provided, the Seminar has been recorded and will be available on the school website in coming days.

Our connection with families is very important to us and having our Year 7 families on board is a very positive outcome.

A big thank you to all the members of the Junior School team for their hard work in organising both the Meet the Techers afternoon and the Seminar. I also acknowledge all the Year 7 teachers who participated in the event.

#### School Swimming Carnival

Whilst the School Swimming Carnival was a great success for all the students who attended and those who participated, as well as all the staff, the level of participation by some cohorts has raised some concern.

There was excellent attendance form our Year 7 and Year 12 students with almost everyone there. A good number of Year 11 and 10 students participated however, I am concerned at the poor attendance of our Middle School Students.

This came about in one of two ways:

- (i) students either absented themselves without permission from their parents/carers or alternatively,
- (ii) parents/carers gave permission to students to not attend.

Either way this is inappropriate and sets an unacceptable precedent. Days like this are official school days and attendance is expected in the same way as it is on any other day.

We are currently reviewing our data and the parents/carers of students who did not attend the Swimming Carnival who had not previously indicated a valid reason for the absence, can expect a letter from the school, asking for your support to ensure that the same does not happen for the Athletics Carnival scheduled for Tuesday the 14 March.

More often than not, the dates of such events are beyond our control, based on the availability of the venues.

I take this opportunity to congratulate all the students who did attend and made the day such a great success. I also wish to thank all the parents/carers who supported the school initiative to provide our student with the opportunity, not only to enjoy the event itself but to also build community.

Congratulations to the staff who put in in a great effort to organise and run the day for the enjoyment of our young people.

#### Reminders: Mobile Phone Policy

Whilst the expectations around mobile phone in pour school was made clear to all students during the first day assemblies, there is a small group of students who choosing to disregard what is expected of them. There is a no tolerance rule around this issue unless a student has a formal exemption from the school which is only provided under extreme, often health related circumstances.

I ask all parents/carers for your support with this by reminding your child(ren) that the Mobile Phone Policy requires students to switch off their phone from the sound of the first warning bell for the day and store their phones away securely until they leave the school at the end of the day. Students are not to access their phones at any time throughout the day including breaks.

A process for addressing a breach of the policy is in place and all students are well aware of their role in this process. Please remind them of the need to follow through with the instructions given to them by any teacher and that disregarding a teacher's instruction will inevitably lead to further consequences.

Parents/carers must not expect to communicate with their children during the day via their mobile phone. Should there be the need to get in touch with your child during the day for an emergency, please contact the general office otherwise please confine any communication for the times when student can access their phones.

#### Year 11 Outdoor and Environmental Studies - URBNSURF

In Week 2 of this term, our current Year 11 Outdoor and Environmental Studies students participated in a day-trip to URBNSURF at Tullamarine here in Melbourne. The students had the opportunity to not only develop their surfing skills in a controlled and predictable setting (see attached photos), but also to apply theory concepts learnt in class with their 11 OES teacher in relation to the differences between built/artificial and natural outdoor environments and the impacts that such environments have on safety, participation and overall enjoyment in recreational activities. It was a fantastic day out, the students had a great experience and some even got to see and get a photo with our elite-level Australian surfer Mick Fanning at the venue.

#### Year 12 Outdoor and Environmental Studies - Wilsons Promontory National Park

In Week 4 of this term, our current Year 12 Outdoor and Environmental Studies students had the opportunity to participate in a 3-day camp program at Wilsons Promontory National Park located in south-eastern Victoria. The students participated in a variety of activities such as a historical education session with a Parks Victoria ranger, developing their practical skills in recreational activities such as Stand-Up Paddleboarding and hiking, as well as cooking on Trangia stoves and setting up four-person tents (see attached photos below). The students also had the opportunity to experience a phenomenal view at sunset from the summit of Mt Oberon (see attached photo below).
