#### PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

#### Student Achievement: International Women's Day 2023 - Pauline Toner Prize

In 2015, our local State Member of Parliament, Vicki Ward MP, created the Pauline Toner Prize to recognise the achievements of local young women active in the areas of social justice, the environment, and/or gender equality.

Vicki has paved this path through the recognition of the remarkable women in previous generations who worked hard to make all of this possible and in particular Pauline Toner, the first female Victorian State Government Minister, the first female State Member for Greensborough and the first female Mayor and Councillor for Diamond Valley.

The Pauline Toner Prize is made available to young women in Years 9 and above who live and/or study in the Seat of Eltham.

Our nominee for 2023 was Scarlett Harrison (Year 10, Andrew House). Scarlett consistently demonstrates a commitment to protecting the environment and works closely with her local and school community to do so, as exemplified by her work in several fields related to the environment and disaster resilience.

At Eltham High School, Scarlett contributed to the "Cups for Change" program; a student-led initiative which targeted single-use coffee cups and promoted awareness of the Eltham Copper Butterfly. Through this program, Scarlett and her peers raised funds for local environmental groups and the establishment of a garden for the Eltham Copper Butterfly.

Outside of school, Scarlett is closely linked with her local CFA group. As part of the Strathewen-Arthurs Creek Bushfire Education Partnership, Scarlett participated in a student-led evaluation, collaborating with her peers to design evaluation surveys, and presenting their results at the Australian Disaster Resilience Conference.

#### Reminders: Congestion in the Withers Way quadrangle of the school

The Withers Way entrance to the school is a space developed to accommodate drivethrough traffic with only limited opportunity to stop for a short period of time to drop off and pick up students.

The mornings are not proving challenging as generally parents/carers arrive, drop off their children and drive off. However, the end of the day is reverting to being quite problematic.

There are clear parking signs distributed throughout this area, which people are ignoring. I will take this opportunity to remind people of what the expectations are in order to maintain a safe area for our students, families and staff to move through at peak, times in particular, at the end of the school day.

The existing parking sign clearly outlines that there is to be no standing outside the administration building between the hours of 8:00-10:00am and 2:00-4:00pm and no standing anytime in other areas of the quadrangle. Furthermore, there are two spots available for disabled parking which must be left unoccupied for their intended purpose. There is also a bus parking bay on the east end of the quadrangle, and this must be always left free allowing for a minibus to park on return from an excursion.

What this means is that no one is allowed to park anywhere in the quadrangle during the times outlined above outside of designated parking bays.

Parents/carers cannot park in the front of the administration building and sit there waiting for their child(ren) to arrive. Double parking is also not allowed, nor parking in front of cars that are parked in parking bays. All of this creates congestion and an unsafe space for our students to move through at the end of the day.

The suggestion is for you to organise to pick up your child(ren) at a point away from the front of the school. However, if you do decide that coming into the circular drive is a must and it is understandable if students are getting picked up with their musical instruments etc. then you are at liberty to stop in the front of the administration building to quickly pick up and then drive through.

If when you arrive, your child(ren) is/are not there, then you are not to park but rather

I also encourage all drivers to maintain safe practices at the Ely Street end of the school and to minimise congestion close to the school exit gates used by the students on their way to the buses.

Eltham High School's Attendance Policy outlines the shared responsibilities in promoting attendance and encouraging engagement and participation at a whole school level. We recognise that effective monitoring and early intervention, by responding quickly with offers to work in partnership with students and their families, is crucial in managing non-attendance so that patterns do not become entrenched. Students are expected to attend school during normal school hours every day of each term unless there are approved exemptions.

Eltham High School aims to ensure that all students enrolled at the school attend regularly to maximise access to learning opportunities, and outlines the processes used to monitor student attendance in our Attendance Policy accessible on our school website or the link above.

#### Student Mobile Phone Management

#### Special Examination Arrangements: VCE External Assessments

Special Examination Arrangements may be approved for students with disabilities, illnesses or other circumstances that affect their ability to access a VCE external assessment. Special Examination Arrangements applications are made to the VCAA by your Senior School Coordinator and must be endorsed by the principal.

Students are eligible for Special Examination Arrangements if it can be demonstrated (professional evidence required) that their capacity to access a VCE external assessment is impaired due to one or more of the following:

- · Mental health conditions
- Health impairment or physical disability
- Specific learning disorders
- · Language disorder
- · Motor coordination disorders
- Deaf and hard of hearing
- Vision impairment

If you think that your student may be eligible to apply or if you had approved provisions last year that you would like to re-apply for please contact the relevant Coordinator. Applications are due Monday 20 March.

We are currently working on the Training Band/Training Strings Instrumental Music fees and we will email you when they have been added to your family account. The email will include how to pay the music fees.

The first instalment, which covers your Instrumental Music Lesson fee, is due for payment by 24 April 2022. The lesson fee will be \$1050.00 (with a reduction for those students on scholarship instruments). An invoice will be emailed once the fees have been added.

The second instalment is due for payment by 1 June 2023 and the final instalment is due for payment by 1 August 2023.

The second instalment is for the Main Ensemble levy which is due for payment by Monday 1 May, 2023.

#### Year 11 Outdoor and Environmental Studies

In Week 5 of this term, our Year 11 Outdoor and Environmental Studies students undertook an overnight camp program in Warburton, located in eastern Victoria near the Yarra Ranges and alongside the Upper Yarra River. The students had the opportunity to engage in recreational activities such as river-sledding down the Upper Yarra, caving in the Britannia Creek Caves, and a bush-tucker educational session run by highly experienced staff from an outsourced provider known as Warburton Adventure Co. In addition, the students had the opportunity to camp in four-person tents in a wilderness environment at Starling's Gap Campground and learn how to cook on trangia stoves.

As part of this program and VCE Units 1 & 2 OES, students learnt how to apply class room theory concepts in relation to motivations for seeking outdoor experiences and personal responses to outdoor experiences, and the impacts these internal factors have on the level of participation in, and overall enjoyment of, outdoor environments.

The students' next camp program will be taking place in Term 2 at Point Leo along the coast here in Victoria.





#### **INFORMATION:**

For young people growing up with internet access, pornography is easy to access and difficult to avoid. It has become a default sex educator for many young people, with serious implications for their ability to develop safe, respectful relationships and sexuality. For autistic young people, pornography's influence can be even more challenging. Monotropism, the key characteristic of autism, can make autistic young people particularly vulnerable to the impacts of pornography.
