Ari was an exceptional student during her time at Eltham High School Class of 2001 and during her time she was encouraged to pursue her passion when studying Media under the guidance of our exceptional teacher Kathy Hughes. In a recent interview for the Saturday paper, Ari made the following comment:

"Cinema wasn't part of our vocabulary until high school. I had a wonderful media teacher – Ms Hughes at Eltham High School – and one of the first things I remember watching was Jane Campion's short films like **Passionless Moments** and **Peel**. I had the revelation that cinema is an art form, that it is malleable and able to express as personal a language as you can have in a painting or a drawing. What you're sculpting is an experience for the viewer..."

On graduating from our school, Ari continued her studies and passion at the Victorian College of the Arts- The University of Melbourne graduating in 2004 with a Bachelor of Film and TV.

We are obviously very proud of Ari's achievements and wish her all the very best at the 94th Academy Awards ceremony will air on television in Australia on Monday 28 March 2022.

Ari has also made history being only the second woman to ever be nominated for Best Cinematography in the film, The Power of the Dog.

In addition to her history making Oscar nomination, Ari has also become the first woman to receive a **BAFTA** nod for cinematography and is the second woman to earn a feature film category nomination from the **American Society of Cinematographers**.

We wish Ari all the very best with her nominations and I invite you all to watch the Academy award presentation in support of Ari on the 28 March.

### VCE Season of Excellence

Last week you would have read that **Emily Broeren (Class of 2021, Everard House)** was selected to exhibit her Art folio in Top Arts later this year. Further to this announcement, Emily has now been invited to present at the Kickstart program 2022. This is an annual event organised by the NGV and AEV where top performing students present their folios and top tips to Art and Studio Arts students and teachers.

Once again congratulations to Emily on her outstanding achievement.

Canoe Slalom Competition:

During the school holidays Sarah Crosbee (Year 10, Rutter House) and Mark Crosbee (Year 12 Rutter House) were busy training and competing in Canoe Slalom.

Sarah competed at the National Age group Championships, held in Eildon, Victoria at the beginning of January. Competing in both C1, (kneeling and using one bladed paddle) and K1 (sitting and using double bladed paddle), she won both her events in Junior and overall. As a result of her wins, Eltham High school placed 3rd in the National schools category.





While Sarah was competing in Eildon, Mark travelled up to Penrith in NSW, to get some training in ahead of the Oceania championships at the end of the month. Sarah joined him after Eildon and they spent the next 3 weeks training on the National White Water course in Penrith.

The Oceania race was the first chance in 2 years for the nation to race together along with a few international paddlers. With commentary and live streaming of video and results it was an intense atmosphere and a great opportunity and both Mark and Sarah raced well.

Overall, Mark finished 3rd Junior K1 and won the C1 event and Sarah was 2nd in the Junior K1 event.

### Safety and School Crossings

With the introduction of the 2022 school year Nillumbik Shire Council would like to take the opportunity to inform parents of our school regarding information around traffic safety issues.

"Traffic safety around school zones is paramount to ensure the safety of our community. Nillumbik Shire Council are in the process of trialling new equipment to assist with patrolling of school zones areas. This trial is expected to run for a duration of approximately six months. This equipment trial will enable council to monitor school zones from a vehicle with cameras affixed and on foot patrols to ensure a safe school zone for all vehicle and pedestrian users.

Please acknowledge this message as a friendly reminder to all parents/carers to ensure they are parking safety, legally and abide by all road rules and ensure to be mindful of speed limits within the area.

Whilst there will be an increased presence in patrols in school zones across Nillumbik Shire Council, we ask that the school community respect officers that may be observed inspecting vehicles and if required issuing infringements.

In addition, we would like to advise Council has completed an audit of all school crossings within Nillumbik, as a result of the audit you may notice some works being conducted to rectify issues identified, i.e. line marking, painting, replacing signage etc.

Keeping everyone safe around schools is a shared responsibility. Be sure to observe all school speed zones and parking restrictions. Patrols around school zones, which are done in conjunction with Victoria Police will also be resuming to help keep children safe. "

### General Achievement Test 2022

VCAA have recently announced the changes to the General Achievement Test 2022

From 2023 we will be transitioning to a new integrated senior secondary certificate. As part of the reform of the VCE and VCAL system, Victorian senior secondary students will this year have their literacy and numeracy skills measured against new standards in a reformed General Achievement Test (GAT).

The 2022 GAT will be held on Wednesday 7 September. The slightly later test date provides the time required to ensure the revised GAT is valid and reliable and for teachers and students to understand the changes – with the test expected to return to its traditional lune date from 2023.

As in all previous years, no special study will be required for the GAT. While the GAT is important, it does not directly count towards a student's final VCE results except in circumstances where a Derived Examination Score is used.

The GAT will be split into two sections – Sections A and B – to be conducted in separate sessions on the same day:

**Section A** will enable students to demonstrate their achievement against new standards of literacy and numeracy and will be administered in the morning session

Section B will assess students' skills, including English, mathematics, science, technology, the arts and humanities, and will be administered in the afternoon session

Further details relating to each section, including session start and end times, will be communicated during Term 1 at the VCE Teachers meeting (week 6). All students enrolled in one or more VCE or scored VCE VET Unit 3–4 sequence are expected to sit both Sections A and B of the GAT.

Senior VCAL students are expected to sit Section A of the GAT and will receive a statement indicating if they have met the literacy and numeracy standards.

### PRIVACY COLLECTION NOTICE

### Information For Students, Parents and Carers

The Department of Education and Training (the Department) values your privacy and is committed to protecting the personal and health information that schools collect.

All school staff must comply with Victorian privacy law and the Schools' Privacy Policy. This notice explains how the Department, including Victorian government schools (schools), handles personal and health information. On occasion, specific consent will be sought for the collection and use of information, for example, for a student to receive a health service. Our schools are also required by legislation, such as the Education and Training Reform Act 2006, to collect some of this information.

Throughout this notice, 'staff' includes principals, teachers, student support service officers, youth workers, social workers, nurses and any other allied health practitioners, and all other employees, contractors, volunteers and service providers of the school and the Department.

On enrolment, and during the ordinary course of a student's attendance at a school, schools will collect information about students and their families for the following purposes:

- · Educating students
- Supporting students' social and emotional wellbeing, and health
- Fulfilling legal obligations, including duty of care, anti-discrimination law and occupational health and safety law
- · Communicating and engaging with parents
- · Student administration
- School management
- Supporting policy in relation to student education and wellbeing.

If this information is not collected, schools may be unable to provide optimal education or support to students or fulfil legal obligations.

For example, our schools rely on parents to provide health information about any medical condition or disability that their child has, medication their child may take while at school, any known allergies and contact details of their child's doctor. If parents do not provide all relevant health information, this may put their child's health at risk.

Our schools also require current, relevant information about all parents and carers so that schools can take account of safety concerns that affect their children. Parents should provide schools with copies of all current parenting plans and court orders about or that affect their children and provide updated copies when they change.

When parents enrol their child in primary school, they will be asked to provide personal and health information in several ways, including via the Enrolment Form, the School Entrance Health Questionnaire (SEHQ) and the Early Childhood Intervention Service (ECIS) Transition Form.

The Enrolment Form is used to collect information that is essential for the purposes listed above, and requests information such as:

- Emergency contacts Individuals parents nominate for a school to contact during an
  emergency. Parents should ensure that their nominated emergency contact agrees
  to their contact details being provided to the school and that they understand their
  details may be disclosed by the Department if lawful, e.g. in the case of emergency
  communications relating to bush fires or floods.
- Student background information Information about country of birth, Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander origin, language spoken at home and parent occupation. This information enables the Department to allocate appropriate resources to schools.
   The Department also uses this information to plan for future educational needs in Victoria and shares some information with the Commonwealth government to monitor, plan and allocate resources.
- Immunisation status This assists schools to manage health risks and legal obligations. The Department may also provide this information to the Department of Health and Department of Families, Fairness and Housing to assess immunisation rates in Victoria, but not in a way which identifies students.
- Visa status This is required to process a student's enrolment.

All schools may use departmental systems and online tools such as apps and other software to effectively collect and manage information about students and families for the purposes listed above.

When schools use these online tools, they take steps to ensure that student information is secure. If parents or carers have any concerns about the use of these online tools, please contact the school.

School staff will only share student and family information with other school staff who need to know to enable them to educate or support the student as described above. Information will only be shared outside the school (and outside the Department) as required or authorised by law, including where sharing is required to meet duty of care, anti-discrimination, occupational health and safety, and child wellbeing and safety obligations. The information collected will not be disclosed beyond the school and Department without parent consent unless such disclosure is lawful.

When a student transfers to another school (including Catholic, independent and interstate), personal and/or health information about that student may be transferred to the next school. Transferring this information is in the best interests of the student and assists the next school to provide the best possible education and support to the student. For further detail about how and what level of information is provided to the next school, refer to the: Enrolment: Student transfers between schools

Schools only provide school reports and ordinary school communications to students, parents, carers or others who have a legal right to that information. Requests for access to other student information or by others must be made by lodging a Freedom of Information (FOI) application.

To update student or family information, parents should contact their school.


