#### PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

#### The Newest Addiction - Vaping

As if young people don't have enough to contend with in current times. Considering that our young people are still dealing with a pandemic and the impacts of forced seclusion on their social development, mental health, wellbeing and learning, they are also confronted with a range of new temptations, including what is being sold to them as a harmless way of relaxing, having fun and forgetting their worries.

Vaping is becoming a major societal issue amongst young people, and our young people at Eltham High School are not immune to the pressures and temptations of this new form of addiction.

As a learning organisation, we are becoming more and more concerned about our young people engaging in a practice, which continues to be sold to them as harmless, but which potentially could have dire consequences on their physical health as well as their mental health and wellbeing. The fact also remains that vaping is an illegal practice for schoolaged children.

I raise this issue with you as a way of encouraging you, parents/carers, to have an open and frank conversation with your child/ren about this issue. In doing so, I ask you to give strong consideration to how you will approach the conversation and, if I may make a suggestion, approach the conversation from the perspective of wanting to understand and to support rather than to chastise and reproach. We very well know from experience that punitive measures just do not work.

I also encourage you to keep your eyes open for any bright coloured cylinders that may appear amongst your child/ren's possessions, potentially labelled with lolly or fruit flavours.

I also raise this issue with you in the hope that you are willing to join us and our students to collectively come up with a way forward to tackle this issue. I think that from our collective experience, we all know that there is no single way to address this but that a multi-pronged approach may result in better outcomes for our young people.

I consistently speak about the value that we place on the home/school partnership, and I often challenge you to take an interest in your child/ren's learning and their health and wellbeing. If we don't work together on this with a concerted effort, we will not be able to improve this situation for our young people.

One thing for sure, I know that irrespective of our efforts, the school will not be able to undertake this work on its own. Without engagement and support from home, what we will be able to achieve will be limited.

#### **Athletics State Championships**

Congratulations to Ally Brooks, (Year 9, Everard House) who has enjoyed a very successful 2022 Victorian Track & Field Championship, winning two Gold medals and a Bronze medal from the three events she entered. The Championships, conducted by Athletics Victoria, were held over the last two weekends of February at Lakeside Stadium, Albert Park.

Ally, 14, lowered her time for the 1500m by 4 seconds when she stormed home to snare third place in the final of the Women Under 16 race. Ally finished in the time of 4:42.36.

In the Women Under 16, 2000m Steeplechase, Ally had a clear hold on second place for most of the race and with another sprint finish from the last water jump she was able to turn silver into gold. Ally won the race in 7:16.13.

In her favourite event, the 800m, Ally qualified for the final by crossing in second place in Round 1 with a run of 2:18.57. In the final of the 800m Ally's talent in track racing was evident as she covered all the moves and swept to the line a clear winner. Ally finished the final in a new personal best time of 2:16.97.

These are all outstanding achievements.

Ally will journey to Sydney to compete in the 2022 Australian Track and Field Championships in late March 2022. We wish her well.

#### **Student Progress Interviews**

#### 2022 CSEF Applications

The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF) provides payments for eligible students to attend activities like:

- School camps or trips
- Swimming and school-organised sport programs
- Outdoor education programs
- **Excursions and incursions**

Applications for 2022 are now open, through until the end of term 2, 2022. If you applied for CSEF at Eltham High School in 2021, you do not need to complete an application form in 2022 unless there has been a change in your family circumstances. Eltham High School will apply for the CSEF on your behalf.

You will only need to submit an application form in 2022 if any of the following changes have occurred:

- New student enrolments: your child has started or changed schools in 2022 or you did not apply at the same school in 2021 or
- Changed family circumstances: such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing at the school in 2022.

Schools are able to accept and process applications up until the end of term two each year. CSEF payments are made to schools from March onwards each year.

#### Oxfam Trailwalk 2022

100km at a Snail's Pace or 20 hours for the Galloping Gastropods?

For the tenth consecutive year (let's pretend 2020 & 2021 didn't happen) Eltham High School will be supporting a team in the Oxfam Trailwalk on March 25 & 26. The Trailwalk is a 100km fundraising event in which all four team members walk the whole 100km. Whilst participants (about 750 teams) have 48 hours to complete the distance, our Eltham High School team are aiming for an ambitious time of 20 hours or less. #### General Achievement Test 2022

VCAA have recently announced changes to the General Achievement Test 2022.

From 2023 we will be transitioning to a new integrated senior secondary certificate. As part of the reform of the VCE and VCAL system, Victorian senior secondary students will this year have their literacy and numeracy skills measured against new standards in a reformed General Achievement Test (GAT).

The 2022 GAT will be held on Wednesday 7 September. The slightly later test date provides the time required to ensure the revised GAT is valid and reliable and for teachers and students to understand the changes – with the test expected to return to its traditional June date from 2023.

As in all previous years, no special study will be required for the GAT. While the GAT is important, it does not directly count towards a student's final VCE results except in circumstances where a Derived Examination Score is used.

The GAT will be split into two sections – Sections A and B – to be conducted in separate sessions on the same day:

Section A will enable students to demonstrate their achievement against new standards of literacy and numeracy and will be administered in the morning session

Section B will assess students' skills, including English, mathematics, science, technology, the arts and humanities, and will be administered in the afternoon session

Further details relating to each section, including session start and end times, will be communicated during Term 1 at the VCE Teachers meeting (week 6). All students enrolled in one or more VCE or scored VCE VET Unit 3–4 sequence are expected to sit both Sections A and B of the GAT.

Senior VCAL students are expected to sit Section A of the GAT and will receive a statement indicating if they have met the literacy and numeracy standards.

Payment of the Music Fees can be made by completing and returning the credit card details on the Credit Card Payment Form emailed to you on 25 February 2022 or by cash, BPay, credit card (over the phone by calling 9430 5118) or by cheque made payable to "Eltham High School". We previously advised that the instrumental music fees would be added to Compass, unfortunately there has been a change to this policy and they will not be added to Compass. The music fees will appear on your family statement, not in the Compass Parent Portal.

If you make a payment via BPay please ensure you email accounts@elthamhs.vic.edu.au advising the funds paid are for music fees. If you do not email they may allocate the funds to other areas.

If you do not know your BPay reference number or would like to set up a payment plan for the Music fees please contact the school's Revenue Administrator, Jacinta D'Avoine on 9430 5118 or by email at accounts@elthamhs.vic.edu.au

The second instalment is for the Main Ensemble levy which is due for payment by 2 May 2022.

The third instalment is for any other items i.e. instrument hire, percussion equipment hire, other ensembles like Stage Band, Jazz Band, Big Band, Choir etc. The third instalment is due by 24 June 2022.

#### LIBRARY

#### Eltham High School's Library Databases and Resources

Students undertaking research tasks need to be aware of the different types of resources available. The internet contains a vast amount of information and sometimes it is not easy to locate what is required at a level appropriate for the student.

For this reason, Eltham High School Library subscribes to a number of databases. One of our most used databases is Australia and New Zealand Reference Centre Plus. This database contains full text articles from Australian and international newspapers, magazines and reference articles.

Aust/NZ Reference Centre Plus can be accessed from home by going to the school website, <a href="www.elthamhs.vic.edu.au">www.elthamhs.vic.edu.au</a> and then logging on to the intranet. From the green intranet homepage, click on the Resource Centre link near the top of the right hand side of the page. This will take you to the Resource Centre homepage. From there, you can access our digital resources.

Not only do students have access to online resources here at school, they also have access to other libraries such as the local library, the State Library and even the National Library of Australia. It is free to become a member of all these libraries. The local library service is the Yarra Plenty Regional Library, <a href="www.yprl.vic.gov.au">www.yprl.vic.gov.au</a>. There are 9 branches across the local area with the nearest branch, Eltham, located at Panther Place. By joining you have access to a variety of online resources and of course, the ability to borrow books, audio books, ebooks etc.

The State Library of Victoria, <a href="www.slv.vic.gov.au">www.slv.vic.gov.au</a>, located in Swanston Street, is another library where it is free to join. By becoming a member, you have access to a number of online databases including the online Encyclopedia Britannica.

The National Library of Australia, <a href="www.nla.gov.au">www.nla.gov.au</a>, located in Canberra, is another library where it is free to join. By joining, you have access to their online databases. One database, Trove, which you can access without being a member, is excellent as a source for Australian History. Trove contains digital copies of old Australian newspapers as well as other Australian historical documents.




