You will only need to submit an application form in 2022 if any of the following changes have occurred:

- New student enrolments: your child has started or changed schools in 2022 or you did not apply at the same school in 2021 or
- Changed family circumstances: such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing at the school in 2022.

Schools are able to accept and process applications up until the end of term two each year. CSEF payments are made to schools from March onwards each year.

General Achievement Test 2022

VCAA have recently announced changes to the General Achievement Test 2022.

From 2023 we will be transitioning to a new integrated senior secondary certificate. As part of the reform of the VCE and VCAL system, Victorian senior secondary students will this year have their literacy and numeracy skills measured against new standards in a reformed General Achievement Test (GAT).

The 2022 GAT will be held on Wednesday 7 September. The slightly later test date provides the time required to ensure the revised GAT is valid and reliable and for teachers and students to understand the changes – with the test expected to return to its traditional June date from 2023.

As in all previous years, no special study will be required for the GAT. While the GAT is important, it does not directly count towards a student's final VCE results except in circumstances where a Derived Examination Score is used.

The GAT will be split into two sections – Sections A and B – to be conducted in separate sessions on the same day:

Section A will enable students to demonstrate their achievement against new standards of literacy and numeracy and will be administered in the morning session

Section B will assess students' skills, including English, mathematics, science, technology, the arts and humanities, and will be administered in the afternoon session

Further details relating to each section, including session start and end times, will be communicated during Term 1 at the VCE Teachers meeting (week 6). All students enrolled in one or more VCE or scored VCE VET Unit 3–4 sequence are expected to sit both Sections A and B of the GAT.

Senior VCAL students are expected to sit Section A of the GAT and will receive a statement indicating if they have met the literacy and numeracy standards.

With the fun of a live DJ, the Year 10s worked through Success without Stress, and the Year 12s, Study Skills for Success. The students were provided with a range of tips and tricks that could start using immediately including ideal study music and study planners. The incursion was a great tool for improving the Year 10s study habits, making them more efficient and easier and reducing the stress that comes with homework. He told an inspiring story of how he overcame his father's abuse of alcohol and his lack of effort in school. Another great part of the presentation was the chat about sleep and its importance towards school and everyday life. The incursion was captivating and interesting though the use of a DJ playing loud music and beats.

Today we participated in the incursion "Success Without Stress". They shared many helpful study tips in a fun and interactive way. We learnt about making a study plan and what the best ways to sustain the information you have learnt, including getting enough sleep, repetition of information and ways to break down the amount of homework so it's not so overwhelming. It really increased by ideas for how to get the most out of studying and using my time effectively. The speaker, Hymil, started off by sharing his struggles growing up with abuse and how he didn't care about anything, however, he managed to find a way to put his everything into school and really turn his life around. These skills that we learnt aren't just about studying at school, they relate back to life, which is why it was so helpful. His story inspired so many teenagers and I hope to see them back at our school to inspire many more.

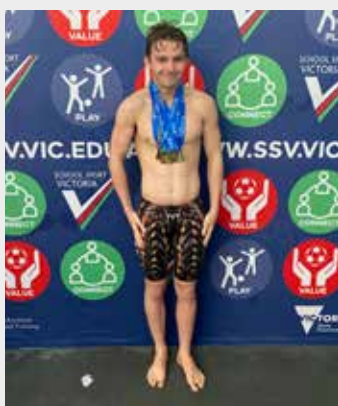
Refreshing Year 9 Business Experiment

LIBRARY

Eltham High School's Library Databases and Resources

Students undertaking research tasks need to be aware of the different types of resources available. The internet contains a vast amount of information and sometimes it is not easy to locate what is required at a level appropriate for the student.

For this reason, Eltham High School Library subscribes to a number of databases. One of our most used databases is Australia and New Zealand Reference Centre Plus. This database contains full text articles from Australian and international newspapers, magazines and reference articles.

Aust/NZ Reference Centre Plus can be accessed from home by going to the school website, www.elthamhs.vic.edu.au and then logging on to the intranet. From the green intranet homepage, click on the Resource Centre link near the top of the right hand side of the page. This will take you to the Resource Centre homepage. From there, you can access our digital resources.

Not only do students have access to online resources here at school, they also have access to other libraries such as the local library, the State Library and even the National Library of Australia. It is free to become a member of all these libraries. The local library service is the Yarra Plenty Regional Library, www.yprl.vic.gov.au. There are 9 branches across the local area with the nearest branch, Eltham, located at Panther Place. By joining you have access to a variety of online resources and of course, the ability to borrow books, audio books, ebooks etc.

The State Library of Victoria, www.slv.vic.gov.au, located in Swanston Street, is another library where it is free to join. By becoming a member, you have access to a number of online databases including the online Encyclopedia Britannica.

The National Library of Australia, www.nla.gov.au, located in Canberra, is another library where it is free to join. By joining, you have access to their online databases. One database, Trove, which you can access without being a member, is excellent as a source for Australian History. Trove contains digital copies of old Australian newspapers as well as other Australian historical documents.

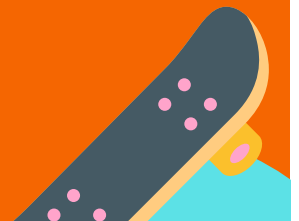
