Student Achievement
Congratulations to Mark Crosbee (Year12, Rutter House) who on 8 July in Ivrea, Italy, took out first place in the 2022 ICF Canoe Slalom Junior / U23 World Championships and was crowned the World Junior C1 champion.

Although Mark qualified in 24th place in the semi-final, he moved up to eighth for the 10 -paddler final, before the run of his life without any gate touches. This saw Mark secure the gold, 0.35 seconds ahead of Michal Urban from Czech Republic in second and Urban's teammate Lukas Kratochvil in third (+0.74).
Mark obviously was able to address any mistakes from the semi-final to rise to the challenge of taking out this prestigious award.
Mark has been a committed competitor in the sport over several years and I am sure that he has high aspirations.

We are immensely proud of his achievements and in congratulating Mark we also congratulate his family who have been a constant source of support over many competitions and training sessions.
We are immensely proud of Mark and look forward to his return so that he can now complete his studies with the same level of commitment in the remaining few weeks of Year 12 with hopefully the same level of success. An amazing effort!

## 2023 Information Evenings

We are currently in the process of running Information Evenings for 2023. Last week we had a highly successful evening presenting students and their families with information about transition from Middle School to Senior School.
The Year 9 to Year 10 Information Evening was well attended and well received. A big thank you to all the families that ventured out on a chilly night and joined the Senior School Team and other staff here at school for this event.
Tonight, 19 July, the Year 10 to Year 11 Information Evening will take place. I encourage all Year 10 families to attend as there will be information about the VCE, the new VCEVocational Major and the Victorian Pathways Certificate. This information will be crucial in supporting students to select the most relevant course in order to reach their desired pathway goals.
The Year 8 to Year 9 Information evening will follow and will take place on a different night. I thank all members of the Senior School Team led by Amanda Saliba, the members of the Middle School Team led by Ross McKinnon and all the staff that attended or will be in attendance tonight and in future to support students and families in making decisions about their 2023 program.
Furthermore, I thank the Assistant Principals who have also attended the evenings in support of the staff.

## Update on the Wearing of Face Masks Advice

You may have already heard in the news that the Victorian Health Department is strongly recommending the wearing of face masks indoors for the remainder of Winter to support prevention of infection of COVID-19, Influenza, Colds and other winter-type illnesses.
As such, the Department of Education alongside its Catholic and Independent School counterparts have set an expectation that all students and staff (with the exception of those who have an exemption) wear face masks whilst indoors. The wearing of face masks outdoors remains a recommendation especially if one cannot maintain a distance of 1.5 m from others.
Face masks are mandatory for those aged eight and over who are household contacts and attending school. This is because the wearing of masks is considered effective in reducing the transmission of COVID-19.

As of Wednesday 20 July, it is expected that all students and staff (except for those exempted) wear face masks whilst indoors. Students are required to provide their own masks and I ask parents/carers for your support in ensuring that your child(ren) have a mask with them all the time. This is crucial if they travel to school via public transport where the wearing of a face mask remains a mandate.
This expectation will not stop student participation in the full range of school activities, including music, sport, and performances where the removal of face masks may be required.
Please see the letter attached on the first page of the Community Annoucements section of this Newsletter. This letter provides direct information around the expectations.

## Exemptions for Testing and Isolation

The period of time when someone is considered a recently confirmed case and therefore exempt from testing and isolation requirements has been reduced from the previous 12 weeks to 4 weeks.
This means that staff and children who are household contacts of people with COVID-19 are now required to undertake the testing and isolation requirements from 4 weeks after completing isolation with COVID-19 themselves. Previously, this exemption period was 12 weeks.
After the 4-week exemption period, students and staff members who are a household contact of a new COVID-19 case, must follow the rules for household contacts, including reporting this to the school.
As part of this they must take five rapid antigen tests (RATs) over 7 days and receive negative test results and wear a face mask (if over 8 years old) in indoor spaces. RAT kits are available from the general office. Every student or their parents/carers and staff may collect a kit of five tests each fortnight.

Tuning in to Teens shows you how to help your teen develop emotional intelligence. Adolescents with higher emotional intelligence:

- are more resilient - this means change and stress are easier to deal with
- are more aware, assertive and strong in situations of peer pressure
- have greater success with making friends and are more able to manage conflict with peers
- are more able to cope when upset or angry
- have fewer mental health and substance abuse difficulties
- have more stable and satisfying relationships as adults
- have greater career success - Emotional intelligence may be a better predictor of academic and career success than IQ!
