### Update on the Wearing of Face Masks Advice

I last week's edition of this newsletter I informed you about the direction that the DET is taking in relation to the wearing of face masks whilst indoors at school for both students and staff.

The DET is asking all students aged 8 and over and all staff in all schools across Victoria to wear masks when in class from now to the end of winter (except where people have previously been granted an exemption from wearing a mask or removing a mask is necessary for clear communication).

This is not a mandate.

We have communicated this request to all students, and we know that it is not an easy thing for our young people and even for us adults to remember when there is one expectation for indoors and another for outdoors.

Having removed their masks during break times outdoors students will enter building without their masks on.

It is the responsibility of teachers to remind student that if they have a mask in their pocket they need to put in on in doors. Students must bring their own mask to school.

If a student chooses not to wear a mask, for whatever reason, they just simply need to indicate to the teacher who has asked them, that they choose not to wear a mask.

Teachers will accept this and not pursue it further. However, as I said earlier, it is the teacher's responsibility for the sake of the wellbeing of the students in their care and their own wellbeing to ask the question.

In the current climate where teacher and student absenteeism due to the pandemic is on the increase, we have a number of Casual Relief Teachers (CRT) in the school at any one time (if we are lucky enough to secure them). These people may change each day so whilst we would love to have a consistent group, changes do occur.

As such it is not possible for us to identify each student who chooses not to wear a mask and then let each teacher know not to ask them the question. With Over 1400 students and 120 teachers this is not a reasonable request.

If a teacher asks your child if they have a mask and asks them to put it on, this is in no way meant to be personal. The teacher is not trying to make your child feel bad or embarrassed, they are fulfilling their responsibility in doing their job.

This may occur more than once in a day, less and less if their regular teachers become aware of this decision but may increase when CRTs take the class.

Prepare your child with a response to the question e.g. "I do not have a mask as I am choosing not to wear one" would suffice.

I ask you for your continued support and understanding so please do not contact the school to voice your discontent that you child may have been asked by three teachers on the one day if they have a mask to put on. Instead use the time to speak with your child, support them to understand that this is not personal, help them to formulate a respectful response for the next time they are asked and help build their resilience.

I assure you that we will continue to do our very best within the parameters we have to work with. I thank you in anticipation of your support.

### Communication of Covid Cases to the School Community

You would have noticed that we have once again picked up our communication of positive COVID-19 cases that have been reported to the school.

A Compass Newsfeed will go out each evening to families of the relevant Year Level(s) in which a positive case has been confirmed. Further to this the communication will also identify if there were any specific activities that the positive case was involved in that may affect students in that year level or across the school.

As an example, in the past week we have had cause to communicate to parents of students who attended a particular Music Camp whose children may have been in the same sleeping quarters as a confirmed positive case that their children are now considered household contacts and need to follow through with the requirements set out for a household contact.

Should you receive such communication there is very little for you to do but monitor your child for any COVID symptoms. If they develop symptoms, they must test immediately. RA Test kits are available as outlined below.

### Reminders: Exemptions for Testing and Isolation

The period of time when someone is considered a recently confirmed case and therefore exempt from testing and isolation requirements has been reduced from the previous 12 weeks to 4 weeks.

This means that staff and children who are household contacts of people with COVID-19 are now required to undertake the testing and isolation requirements from 4 weeks after completing isolation with COVID-19 themselves. Previously, this exemption period was 12 weeks.

After the 4-week exemption period, students and staff members who are a household contact of a new COVID-19 case, must follow the rules for household contacts, including reporting this to the school.

As part of this they must take five rapid antigen tests (RATs) over 7 days and receive negative test results and wear a face mask (if over 8 years old) in indoor spaces. RAT kits are available from the general office. Every student or their parents/carers and staff may collect a kit of five tests each fortnight.

### **Edendale Farm Visit**

On the first week of Term 3, all of our Year 7s went on an excursion to Edendale Farm to learn about sustainability and what we can do to live more sustainable lives. Form groups K, L and M went on Friday July 15, and did three rotations of activities. The first rotation was run by Polly, and we learnt about different types of waste we have in our households like general, recycling, soft plastics, green waste, composting, e-waste, and the safe disposal of batteries. Then, we sorted through everything that was in the general red bin, into all the other categories of bins. By the end of the activity, the red bin was nearly empty, and we had all learnt how to safely dispose of rubbish sustainably to avoid landfill.

For the second activity, which was run by Brian, we learnt about our food footprint and how far our food had travelled to get to us. We split into four groups and each group was given a tub of various food products and the task to order them from least distance travelled to get to our supermarket shelves, to furthest distance to get to us. We also learnt about the sneaky marketing strategies to make us think that our food is coming from locally sourced produce, when actually they are being imported from all parts of the world creating unnecessary, carbon-polluting food kilometres.

For the last and final activity, Katrina gave us an interactive tour of Edendale Farm. We got to feed the sheep, alpacas, chickens, and goats. We learnt about how they rotate animals around to different paddocks to make sure that the soil get to replenish itself and is healthy to produce fresh green grass. At the end of the day, we thanked all the educators at Edendale and the teachers that organised and safely walked us there and back.

We're looking forward to putting some of these strategies in place in our own homes.
