General Achievement Test (GAT)

The GAT in its new format ran today on Wednesday 7 September.

All students undertaking a Unit 3/4 sequence of study were required to undertake both components of the GAT. VCAL students, for the first time, were also required to undertake the first component of the GAT.

Staff have worked hard to familiarise the students with the requirements of the GAT and to emphasise the importance of authentic participation.

The students arrived eagerly to complete the assessment and from an administrative perspective it seems that all has proceeded as expected. The students seemed happy.

Sitting under exam condition for an extended period of time, has also served as good preparation for the upcoming Units 3/4 practice exams in the first week of the term 3 break.

A big thank you to Darren Squires and the senior school team for the organisation of the GAT and for managing the variety of special exam conditions for a number of our students.

R U OK Day

Students must enter via the main school entrance and ensure that they arrive 15 minutes prior to your exam start. The rest of the school will be locked so students will not be able to access any other part of the school during this time. Students are to ensure they take everything they need home at the end of Term 3 in preparation to sit these exams.

Become a qualified Swim Teacher or Lifeguard (minimum age 16 years)

This project is to increase the number of qualified Swim Teachers and Lifeguards in Metropolitan and is being funded by the State Government. The Vicswim program is run by Aquatics and Recreation Victoria (ARV) during the first three weeks of January.

The program offers senior students the opportunity to become a qualified Swim Teacher or Lifeguard. The course enrolment would be paid for by this project. They will also assist to find a course that is conveniently located.

The only requirement is that the course is completed successfully, and an undertaking is given to be available to work on the Vicswim program 2023. This is a commitment of 3 weeks in January and is a paid position.

The minimum age is 16 years to complete the course, but would be formally qualified once they turn 17 years.




