PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

In the True Spirit of Reconciliation

It is certainly uplifting when one hears a story that authentically demonstrates the spirit of reconciliation, and when reconciliation goes both ways demonstrating a genuine sense of understanding, acceptance and forgiveness. It makes us really wonder why we are still at such a distance from what true reconciliation could be.

Such a story is the story of one of our staff members and his family.

Ross McKinnon recently travelled to Uluru to witness an event that he felt strongly about. He wasn't sure what to expect or whether he would in fact be welcomed by our First Nations People. What he experienced was a true sense of reconciliation, a preparedness for forgiveness and acceptance. This is his story:



"Return to Uluru

On October 13, 1934, an Anangu man called Yokun was killed at Mutitjulu water hole, a sacred site at the base of Uluru.

Yokun and five other Anangu men had been pursued and captured by a Northern Territory police officer, on suspicion of their involvement in administering an act of traditional law.

Whilst being marched to Alice Springs, and despite the neck chains, Yokun escaped custody and was pursued for days across the central desert. Yokun's brother, Paddy Uluru, was a traditional custodian of Uluru, which may explain why they headed towards Uluru after escaping custody.

The police officer eventually tracked the men down at Mutijulu water hole, where Yokun took refuge in a cave, possibly as a distraction so his friends could escape. With only stones to defend himself against the armed police officer, Yokun refused to leave the shelter of the cave. The police officer fired two rounds into the cave, mortally wounding Yokun who was dragged out of the cave and died a few hours later.

Yokun's remains, like those of so many First Nations people around the world, ended up in a university and a museum.

On October 13, 2022, Yokun's remains were returned to the community and buried at Mutijulu water hole. I had the privilege of attending this repatriation ceremony.

Student Free Day - Thursday 13 October

Last Thursday all staff, teachers and education support staff alike, took part in the first stage of the professional learning associated with the Berry Street Education Model.

Coming out of the last couple of years has certainly been challenging for most of us. The trauma that we all experienced because of the COVID-19 Pandemic and the associated lockdowns has certainly impacted on our wellbeing and on the way in which we both approach and respond to life. In a learning community this is clearly reflected in the way that we approach and respond to learning. To this end we decided that the Berry Street Education Model would support us all in working alongside our young people and our families.

The Berry Street Education Model isn't a program but rather a way of being and doing that highlights trauma informed practices so that we can better understand and respond to the needs of our young people, their families as well, as each other.

The professional learning is evidence-based and has demonstrated a number of very positive outcomes in a range of school settings in which it has been applied.

This is a big commitment on the part of the school both financially and timewise. However, our research indicates that it is the right initiative for us as it clearly aligns with our School Values.

The Berry Street Education Model will allow us to engage with our young people and their families from their point of need and being mindful what "space" they are in at the time.

We feel that it is both money and time well spent.

Reminders: Day Before Melbourne Cup Day - 1 November

Historically the day before the Melbourne Cup holiday has had very poor student attendance. Consequently, and as a way of causing the least disruption to the educational program of the school, the last few years have seen this day used as time-in-lieu for teachers. As clearly expressed in the Victorian Government Schools Agreement 2022 and supported by the Department of Education and Training, this compensates teachers for the time they allocate beyond work hours throughout the year to student progress interviews involving students, parents, and staff.

In the past, irrespective of the time-in-lieu arrangement, the school has remained open on the Monday before Melbourne Cup Day as Year 12 exams are generally on during that time, and the school is an examination centre. This will also be the case this year.

However, while this day would seem to be the most appropriate in terms of minimising disruption to the educational program of the school in the provision of time-in-lieu, I am writing to ascertain your intention as to your child's/children's attendance on **Monday**, **31 October** for us to plan effectively. The school will be open on this day and based on previous experience, due to the small numbers of students in attendance, it is most likely that an alternative educational program will be in place. Your information will be valuable in ascertaining staffing requirements for this day.

Covid Update

The following is the latest information re COVID-19:

The Victorian Government has announced the end of the Pandemic Declaration and associated Pandemic Orders.

The following settings, based on advice from the Department of Health, will apply from 11.59pm Wednesday 12 October 2022.

It is strongly recommended that students:

- Who test positive to covid-19 stay home and isolate for 5 days
- Should not attend school after 5 days if still symptomatic
- Who are symptomatic but have not tested positive should not attend school
- Advise the school of the covid-19 positive test result

Where students become symptomatic at school they should:

- Be collected by their parents/carers
- Undergo testing for COVID-19

It is strongly recommended that staff:

- Who test positive to covid-19 stay home and isolate for 5 days
- · Should not attend after 5 days if still symptomatic
- Who are symptomatic but have not tested positive should not attend school
- Report their positive test result to the school and through eduPay

Reporting positive COVID-19 test results

The Department of Health recommends that a person who tests positive for COVID-19 should inform those with whom they have recently been in contact, including their workplace, schools and household.

Parents and carers will therefore be asked to continue to report positive student COVID-19 cases using the VicED COVID Tool.

COVID-19 vaccination changes

The current mandatory vaccination requirement for staff and visitors, contractors and volunteers working in specialist schools will cease to apply from 11.59pm Wednesday 12 October. COVID-19 vaccination, including booster doses, continues to be strongly recommended for all school staff.

Face masks

Staff and students who wish to wear a face mask should be supported to do so, and schools should continue to make face masks available for staff, students and visitors.

The Department of Health recommends that masks should be worn by a person who is a close contact of someone who has tested positive for COVID-19 when leaving home.

Additionally, the Department of Health recommends that masks should be worn by a person who has COVID-19, for at least 7 days after a positive test, when they need to leave home.

ASSISTANT PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Health Support Planning Strategy

At Eltham High School we aim to ensure all students feel safe and supported at school. We do this by working with families to ensure that clear plans and processes are developed and maintained to support the student's health care needs, either on enrolment or when a health care need is identified. In addition, we allocate time to discuss, practice and review health support planning policies and processes.

Students with an identified medical condition are required to have a current medical action plan to assist with health support planning at school.

We require medical details to be provided for all students upon enrolment at the school and require families to provide an update on medical conditions annually. We require an update of medical action plans for all medical conditions no later than the beginning of term two each year. In addition, families will have the opportunity to review and update details when the Student Information Details are sent out at the beginning of semester two each year.

Where it is necessary for your child to have medication at school (i.e. Epipen / insulin) it is imperative that this is kept up to date and replaced by you when necessary.

If a student requires medication, it is strongly encouraged for the medication to be arranged to be taken outside of school hours. We will follow procedures set out in our policy Administration of Medication (available at this Link) to safely manage any necessary provision of medication to students while at school or during school activities undertaken outside of the school grounds such as camps and excursions.

Sun Smart and Dress Code

Sun safety is a shared responsibility. Staff, parents and students are encouraged to implement a combination of sun protection measures whenever UV levels reach 3 and above (typically from mid-August to the end of April in Victoria). Ceramic Jewellery Making Workshops

Ceramic jewellery making workshops facilitated by local ceramic artist Emma Amos have been organised for staff and students.

The student workshop is an enrichment opportunity aimed at Year 9 and 10 students who have been recommended for participation by their teachers because of their engagement and achievements in the visual arts.


