Student Achievement: 2022 Australian Olympic Change-Maker Award

Congratulations to our nominee for the 2022 Olympic Change-Maker Award. Fieke Van der Kamp (Year 12, Stewart House) is a recipient of this award for 2022.

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The Australian Olympic Committee (AOC) selected Fieke for this award in recognition of her demonstration of the Olympic Spirit through leadership and driving positive change in our community to build a better world through sport. In 2022, a number of students will receive the Award from schools across Australia.

The nominations have overwhelmingly highlighted how students have used sport to create change in some of the most creative and unexpected ways proving that the power of sport is truly limitless.

Olympians Taliqua Clancy, Cedric Dubler, Valentino Guseli and Gronya Somerville, at the National Forum held on Friday 9 September, shared their Olympic journey with the students whilst celebrating the values of excellence, friendship, and respect.

These are values that are closely aligned with our school values and those which Fieke lives each day.

Fieke submitted a video as part of her nomination, as did a number of other students across the country. The initiatives and creativity demonstrated through these uncertain times is testament to the resilience and positive force for change playing out across the country. A panel of Olympians are currently reviewing video submissions.

In late October, successful applicants and their schools will be contacted directly and invited to attend the National Summit from 7-9 December 2022. Their names will also be posted on the AOCM webpage.

This is great recognition for Fieke who is passionate for her sport and has been constant in her approach and effort to making this world a better place. We are very proud of her and wish her all the very best for the future.

Congratulations to Jes Broeren (Class of 2017, Everard House) who has recently been awarded a Fellowship with the Sydney Symphony Orchestra. This is quite literally 1 of 2 Australian opportunities (Melbourne Symphony Orchestra being the other) that every aspiring classical musician hope for.



The Sydney Symphony Orchestra Fellows have the opportunity to be inspired by musical greats – while on the path to becoming leading musicians themselves.

For over 20 years, the program has seen Fellows go on to enjoy highly successful careers in Australia and abroad. Over 85% of the Sydney Symphony Orchestra Fellowship alumni are professional musicians

The Fellowship program lays the groundwork through intense preparation and training including masterclasses with globally renowned artists, mentorship from the Sydney Symphony's musicians, and the opportunity to play in chamber and orchestral performances, including mainstage and regional programs.

Fellows are supported with further development of technical skills, insights into career management and preparation for auditions – helping to develop sustainable and rewarding careers.

It is great to see one of our own be recognised with such a prestigious award. I know that Jes has achieved this through hard work and persistence, and we are all very proud of him.

Jes first picked up a clarinet at the Year 7 "Try an Instrument Night" at school. Eltham High School continued to nurture Jes' interest and passion for music for the remainder of the six years that he was here, then moving to the Melbourne Conservatorium of Music at the University of Melbourne for his tertiary studies.

We wish Jes every success as he moves into this amazing opportunity and the next stage of his career development.

Victorian Labor Party Election Promise

On Monday 24 October, the Minister for Education and Minister for Women, the Hon. Natalie Hutchins MP announced that a re-elected Andrews Labor Government will deliver a significant expansion to Eltham High School.

The minister announced an investment of \$8.94 million for the development of a STEAM/ Science facility on the school site replacing facilities that are consistently becoming more and more expensive to maintain and that do not effectively support the type of learning required in the 21st Century.

The Victorian Government has acknowledged that for the school to deliver on the State Government's agenda around STEAM education, industry and the labor force, alongside its extensively researched and evidence-based education rationale the school and our students need state of the art facilities that will allow them to engage in learning though approaches anchored in lateral and creative thinking, looking at problems as new challenges and engage with them through a variety of lenses.

The news was delivered to us on Monday morning by our local State Member, Vicki Ward MP. I can tell you that this was certainly music to our ears as we have been working towards this for some time now.

Students from across Years 9-12 delivered a presentation to Vicki and to our Northeast Melbourne Area Director (DET) Stacey Gabriel on Tuesday morning, 25 October.

In their presentation, the students clearly expressed what an announcement such as this can mean for our school and most importantly for their learning. The area of STEAM is becoming a strong focus of our school and if this facility comes to fruition, it will enhance our ability to reach our goals in a more timely and successful manner.

The school would like to acknowledge Vicki Ward's advocacy in achieving this outcome and look forward to her continued support if the Andrews Labor Government is re-elected in November.

Should this not occur, we will certainly continue to present our case to whatever government attains power in the upcoming election.

Reminders: Day Before Melbourne Cup Day - 1 November

Historically the day before the Melbourne Cup holiday has had very poor student attendance. Consequently, and as a way of causing the least disruption to the educational program of the school, the last few years have seen this day used as time-in-lieu for teachers. As clearly expressed in the Victorian Government Schools Agreement 2022 and supported by the Department of Education and Training, this compensates teachers for the time they allocate beyond work hours throughout the year to student progress interviews involving students, parents, and staff.

In the past, irrespective of the time-in-lieu arrangement, the school has remained open on the Monday before Melbourne Cup Day as Year 12 exams are generally on during that time, and the school is an examination centre. This will also be the case this year.

However, while this day would seem to be the most appropriate in terms of minimising disruption to the educational program of the school in the provision of time-in-lieu, I am writing to ascertain your intention as to your child's/children's attendance on **Monday**, **31 October** for us to plan effectively. The school will be open on this day and based on previous experience, due to the small numbers of students in attendance, it is most likely that an alternative educational program will be in place. Your information will be valuable in ascertaining staffing requirements for this day.

Covid Update

The following is the latest information re COVID-19:

The Victorian Government has announced the end of the Pandemic Declaration and associated Pandemic Orders.

The following settings, based on advice from the Department of Health, will apply from 11:59pm Wednesday 12 October 2022.

It is strongly recommended that students:

- Who test positive to covid-19 stay home and isolate for 5 days
- Should not attend school after 5 days if still symptomatic
- Who are symptomatic but have not tested positive should not attend school
- Advise the school of the covid-19 positive test result

Where students become symptomatic at school they should:

- Be collected by their parents/carers
- Undergo testing for COVID-19

It is strongly recommended that staff:

- Who test positive to covid-19 stay home and isolate for 5 days
- Should not attend after 5 days if still symptomatic
- Who are symptomatic but have not tested positive should not attend school

Reporting positive COVID-19 test results

The Department of Health recommends that a person who tests positive for COVID-19 should inform those with whom they have recently been in contact, including their workplace, schools and household.

Parents and carers will therefore be asked to continue to report positive student COVID-19 cases using the VicED COVID Tool.

COVID-19 vaccination changes

The current mandatory vaccination requirement for staff and visitors, contractors and volunteers working in specialist schools will cease to apply from 11.59pm Wednesday 12 October. COVID-19 vaccination, including booster doses, continues to be strongly recommended for all school staff.

Face masks

Staff and students who wish to wear a face mask should be supported to do so, and schools should continue to make face masks available for staff, students and visitors.

The Department of Health recommends that masks should be worn by a person who is a close contact of someone who has tested positive for COVID-19 when leaving home.

Additionally, the Department of Health recommends that masks should be worn by a person who has COVID-19, for at least 7 days after a positive test, when they need to leave home.

Student Mobile Phone Management

The Victorian Government takes very seriously the safe and responsible use of digital technologies, student safety and wellbeing, and the development of social skills and positive behaviour. 2023 Music Program Intention

In order to plan for 2023, all students are required to confirm that they are continuing in the Instrumental Music Program for 2023.

You will have received an email regarding the 2023 Intention process.

You are required to complete either a Google document form or a hard copy form and pay a non-refundable \$100.00 deposit to secure your place for 2023. The \$100.00 non-refundable deposit is to be paid via a Compass event and it will be applied to the 2023 music fees.

There will be an incremental increase in the music fees for 2023 to cover the increase in costs associated with running the program. You will be notified of the 2023 music fees before the end of 2022. The music budget and fees are currently being approved by the Finance Committee and that is why we cannot provide them to you at this time.

All 2022 Instrumental Music fees are now overdue and must be paid in full for your child to be able to enrol in the 2023 Music Program.

If you currently have a payment plan in place, please note it is required to be completed by the end of 2022. Payment plans do not roll over from one year to the next and need to be formalised with the Finance Department each year.

As the Eltham High School Music Program is a self-funded program, all fees are to be paid by the due dates. If a student withdraws from the Music Program at any time during the year, full yearly fees are payable. This is to ensure the school is able to meet the financial commitment it makes to employ Casual Instrumental Music Staff based on the confirmed enrolment of students in the Music Program as indicated by the returned Intention forms.

Please ensure you have paid the \$100.00 non-refundable deposit, completed the Google document or returned a hard copy form to the General Office or Music Office by no later than Friday 11 November 2022.

Ceramic Jewellery Making Workshops

Ceramic Jewellery Making workshops facilitated by local ceramic artist Emma Amos have been organised for staff and students.

The student workshop is an enrichment opportunity aimed at Year 9 and 10 students who have been recommended for participation by their teachers because of their engagement and achievements in the visual arts.

Participants will learn the process of creating jewellery from clay. Impressions are added to the clay using natural objects, stamps and textural surfaces. Following a bisque firing the ceramic pieces will be decorated with oxides and glazes.

After the glaze firing the ceramic pieces are then threaded or assembled into jewellery using leather thonging, beads or jewellery findings such as brooch backs, earrings or ring bases.

Eltham High School staff are also participating in the workshops after school as an opportunity to learn something new and promote wellbeing.

The first of three workshops were completed on Monday 10 October.
