In order to support our Year 10 students to achieve success in their studies and preparedness for VCE, Senior School is implementing a Year 10 CAT (Common Assessment Task) Redemption Session after school on selected Thursdays throughout the term, from 3:15pm – 4:25pm in Room 321/322.

Year 10 students will be booked into this session if:

- They have missed a CAT in class due to being absent for either medical or school approved activities such as excursion, camp, school sport, music or other extra-curricular activities.
- The CAT that was submitted has not satisfactorily met the requirements of the task. In this case a redemption task will be given to provide another opportunity for the student to demonstrate their understanding of key knowledge and skills being assessed.

The CAT redemption session will appear on the student's Compass schedule. We encourage students with part-time employment to allow for this when advising their employer of their availability. Please contact the relevant Year 10 Coordinator if you have any further questions.

GAT Information Sessions

The GAT will be held on Thursday 15 June. All students enrolled in one or more VCE or scored VCE VET Unit 3-4 sequences will sit Sections A and B of the GAT, and students enrolled in one or more VCE VM Unit 3-4 sequence will sit Section A.

To best prepare students to complete the GAT, Senior School will hold two compulsory information sessions that will now appear on each students Compass schedule.

Late in Term 1, our students were very busy representing Eltham High School at a number of events in various spaces. We had students attend Rainbow Monday, the GRIP Student Leadership Conference, and Legacy's ANZAC Service at the Shrine of Remembrance. You can read more about these events in the reports below.

Rainbow Monday

In April, I had the pleasure of representing Eltham High School at local MP Vicki Ward's Rainbow Monday, a pride event in response to the recent hateful demonstration outside Victoria's Parliament House. Held at her office (which was covered in rainbow decorations) this event was attended by people of all ages, members of the LGBTQIA+ community and allies. As some of the younger people in attendance, my friend and I were quickly made welcome by Vicki herself, as well as her staff. Despite the negative event this gathering was in response to, it was clear the focus of the gathering was to celebrate Eltham's rich queer community and to offer a show of support to all those in it. There were drinks, food, music and decorations, but the highlight of the event was the presence of Minister for Equality the Hon. Harriet Shing, the first openly lesbian member of the Victorian Parliament. She personally introduced herself to everyone in the room, before making a moving speech that left myself, and many others with tears in our eyes. She highlighted the importance of events such as this, and left us with an impactful message: awareness, celebration and a loud presence is the only way to fight hatred.

Legacy ANZAC Commemoration Service

The ceremony was made up of speeches from Her Excellency the Honorable Linda Dessau AC, and Mr. Anthony Howard AM QC. Linda Dessau spoke about the importance of remembrance, Anthony Howard told stories of some of the young people who joined the forces and lost their life at Gallipoli. During the service we sang the National anthem, 'I am Australian', and 'Waltzing Matilda', and the poems 'In Flanders Fields' and 'We shall keep faith' were read out by students from other schools. Stephanie and Tom represented the school by placing Eltham High's wreath at the base of the Shrine. My biggest takeaways from the ceremony are the stories of the young soldiers who went to protect our country and the sacrifices made during war times.

Free Family Counselling – Strengthening Connection

'Matters' is a free family therapy program that supports families who live in Melbourne's North East region. The program works with a diverse range of families who are experiencing challenges with relational functioning and connection.

The therapists work with the '*whole of family*', which allows various family members to attend sessions individually or together. This approach gives each family member the opportunity to express their thoughts or feelings, not only about the problem, but also possible solutions.

PORN IS NOT THE NORM

Young People, Autism & the Impact of Porn

Online Presentation for PARENTS AND CARERS

With Maree Crabbe and Dr. Wenn Lawson



INFORMATION:

For young people growing up with internet access, pornography is easy to access and difficult to avoid. It has become a default sex educator for many young people, with serious implications for their ability to develop safe, respectful relationships and sexuality. For autistic young people, pornography's influence can be even more challenging. Monotropism, the key characteristic of autism, can make autistic young people particularly vulnerable to the impacts of pornography. Pornography's messages can be a source of confusion and concern, and shape unrealistic and unhealthy sexual understandings and expectations.

This session seeks to support parents and carers of autistic young people to understand pornography's prevalence and influence, its implications for autistic young people, and how we can support them to navigate respectful, consenting and safe sexuality and relationships in this new reality.
