Planning For 2024 - Update

Our work for the start of the 2024 school year is proceeding well.

In a previous edition of this newsletter, I outlined the changes to the structure of the day from a four period day to a five period day and the organisation of the day in terms of teaching lessons and breaks. What we had not identified at that point in time was the start and end of the day for students.

We have very little flexibility in that a large number of our students rely on buses for their transport to and from school. We have been in contact with the bus company to see if there was any flexibility in the pickup times from both the Eltham Station at the start of the day or from the school at the end of the day which would then allow us to set start and finish times that would better suit our school program and the students.

Unfortunately, the response was not positive and therefore we will need to work within the parameters set by the bus company. Whilst the start and finish time for students won't be too different to what it is now, the following is an indication of where we are heading:

We are excited to be involved in this work and although this adds to our workload, we are very pleased that we are already on the move with this project towards achieving our goal for our students.

There is not much to report on at this stage, but rest assured that I will keep you informed as we proceed with this work. Shortly we will be communicating our plan to undertake this work to our local and wider community.

PARENTS AND CARERS

Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability

Dear parents, guardians and carers,

Every year, all schools in Australia participate in the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD). The NCCD process requires schools to identify information already available in the school about supports provided to students with disability. These relate to legislative requirements under the Disability Discrimination Act 1992 and the Disability Standards for Education 2005, in line with the NCCD guidelines (2019).

Information provided about students to the Australian Government for the NCCD includes:

- Year of schooling
- · Category of disability: physical, cognitive, sensory or social/emotional
- Level of adjustment provided: support provided within quality differentiated teaching practice, supplementary, substantial or extensive.

This information assists schools to:

- Formally recognise the supports and adjustments provided to students with disability in schools
- Consider how they can strengthen the support of students with disability in schools
- Develop shared practices so that they can review their learning programs in order to improve educational outcomes for students with disability.

The NCCD provides state and federal governments with the information they need to plan more broadly for the support of students with disability.

The NCCD will have no direct impact on your child and your child will not be involved in any testing process. The school will provide data to the Australian Government in such a way that no individual student will be able to be identified – the privacy and confidentiality of all students is ensured. All information is protected by privacy laws that regulate the collection, storage and disclosure of personal information. 2023 CSEF Applications

A reminder to families that applications for CSEF in 2023 close on the last day of Term 2 - 23 June 2023.

The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF) provides payments for eligible students to attend activities like:

- · School camps or trips
- Swimming and school-organised sport programs
- Outdoor education programs
- · Excursions and incursions

If you applied for the CSEF at Eltham High School in 2022, you do not need to complete an application form in 2023 unless there has been a change in your family circumstances. Eltham High School will apply for the CSEF on your behalf.

You will only need to submit an application form in 2023 if any of the following changes have occurred:

- New student enrolments: your child has started or changed schools in 2023 or you did not apply at the same school in 2022 or
- Changed family circumstances: such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing at the school in 2023.

If applications submitted by the end of term are successful, funds will be made available to families during Term 3.

Payment Process and Closing Dates for Excursions and Activities via Compass

Camps, Excursions, and other school based activities that have a financial charge associated with them fall under the Extra-Curricular Items and Activities category of fees and are offered to students on a 'user pays' basis. They are offered in addition to the standard curriculum.

Cut off dates for payment and consent on Compass are set by the school to assist us in meeting our financial and duty of care requirements for each event. In support of meeting these obligations, we will not extend due dates for events or take late payments.

Administration staff send an email to families when the event is published and a reminder email five days prior to the event closing date. Students are also reminded by their classroom teachers about events and when payment and consent must be received. If payment or consent is not received by the due date, your child will be excluded from the activity and will be supervised by teachers at school.

If you have received CSEF funding and would like to allocate it towards a Compass Event, or have credit on your family statement that you would like to use, please contact Jacinta D'Avoine (Revenue Administrator) 9430 5118 or email accounts@elhamhs.vic.edu.au to arrange for the allocation to be processed.

Please ensure that if payment is made via CSEF, credit allocation or an alternate method to Compass, please ensure that you consent via Compass prior to the closing date once the allocation has been made or payment has been receipted by the school.

If you are having issues accessing Compass, please contact the school for assistance. Thank you for your support with this matter.

MIDDLE SCHOOL

Middle School Cross Country Ski Day (Year 8 & 9 students)

Do you like the snow? Never been but would like to try? Like to try cross-country skiing?

Year 8 and 9 students are invited to participate in a 1 day cross-country ski trip to Lake Mountain on Monday 24 July. No prior experience is required.

Year 7 students can choose between a combination of Zumba and Pilates classes at the Eltham Leisure Centre, or professional basketball coaching provided by HoopCity Eltham.

Researchers from Monash University and Deakin University are offering parents a FREE online parenting program designed to support parents of teenagers who have difficulty attending school due to anxiety, depression, or emotional distress (sometimes called 'school refusal', 'school can't', or 'school phobia'). The program is being offered as part of a research trial.

What's included in the program?

- A parenting self-assessment tool with personalised feedback
- Up to 13 online modules with practical strategies to support your teen's mental health and school attendance
- · Complete weekly modules and work towards goals

Who can take part?

You may be eligible to participate if:

- you are the parent or guardian of a teenager aged 12-18 live in Australia
- can read, write, and speak in English,
- · have regular access to the Internet.

The program is not recommended as a sole source of support for young people experiencing school refusal. We recommend seeking professional support from a mental health or education professional alongside completing this program. Although all parents are able to take part, please also note that the program content is not tailored for parents of teenagers with Autism Spectrum Disorder or intellectual disability

What else is involved?

To help us evaluate the program, we'll ask you to complete two online surveys about your parenting and your teen's mental health. We may also invite you to complete an interview about your experience with the program. You'll receive a \$20 gift voucher after completing the second survey, and an additional \$20 gift voucher if you complete an interview.


