Eltham High School STEAM Centre

We are currently completing the documentation of the Asset Management Plan (AMP1) stage 1 which outlines the school's education rationale detailing the school's preferred future in relation to teaching and learning with very little mention of facilities at this stage. The AMP1 has been created through consultation with various stakeholders and will be presented to our School Council for endorsement at our meeting this coming Thursday.

The Plan is due to the Victorian Schools Building Authority by the 13 July but it is my hope that we will be able to submit it prior to that date.

The Plan is only part of the initial strategy for the development of the new School Master Plan after which we will begin having conversations with architects (AMP2).

PARENTS AND CARERS

Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability

Every year, all schools in Australia participate in the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD). The NCCD process requires schools to identify information already available in the school about supports provided to students with disability. These relate to legislative requirements under the Disability Discrimination Act 1992 and the Disability Standards for Education 2005, in line with the NCCD guidelines (2019).

Information provided about students to the Australian Government for the NCCD includes:

- Year of schooling
- Category of disability: physical, cognitive, sensory or social/emotional
- Level of adjustment provided: support provided within quality differentiated teaching practice, supplementary, substantial or extensive.

This information assists schools to:

- Formally recognise the supports and adjustments provided to students with disability in schools
- Consider how they can strengthen the support of students with disability in schools
- Develop shared practices so that they can review their learning programs in order to improve educational outcomes for students with disability.

The NCCD provides state and federal governments with the information they need to plan more broadly for the support of students with disability.

The NCCD will have no direct impact on your child and your child will not be involved in any testing process. The school will provide data to the Australian Government in such a way that no individual student will be able to be identified – the privacy and confidentiality of all students is ensured. All information is protected by privacy laws that regulate the collection, storage and disclosure of personal information. 2023 CSEF Applications

A reminder to families that applications for CSEF in 2023 close on the last day of Term 2 - 23 June 2023.

The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF) provides payments for eligible students to attend activities like:

- School camps or trips
- Swimming and school-organised sport programs
- Outdoor education programs
- Excursions and incursions

If you applied for the CSEF at Eltham High School in 2022, you do not need to complete an application form in 2023 unless there has been a change in your family circumstances. Eltham High School will apply for the CSEF on your behalf.

You will only need to submit an application form in 2023 if any of the following changes have occurred:

- New student enrolments: your child has started or changed schools in 2023 or you did not apply at the same school in 2022 or
- Changed family circumstances: such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing at the school in 2023.

If applications submitted by the end of term are successful, funds will be made available to families during Term 3.

Payment Process and Closing Dates for Excursions and Activities via Compass

Camps, Excursions, and other school based activities that have a financial charge associated with them fall under the Extra-Curricular Items and Activities category of fees and are offered to students on a 'user pays' basis. They are offered in addition to the standard curriculum.

Cut off dates for payment and consent on Compass are set by the school to assist us in meeting our financial and duty of care requirements for each event. In support of meeting these obligations, we will not extend due dates for events or take late payments.

Administration staff send an email to families when the event is published and a reminder email five days prior to the event closing date. Students are also reminded by their classroom teachers about events and when payment and consent must be received. If payment or consent is not received by the due date, your child will be excluded from the activity and will be supervised by teachers at school.

If you have received CSEF funding and would like to allocate it towards a Compass Event, or have credit on your family statement that you would like to use, please contact Jacinta D'Avoine (Revenue Administrator) 9430 5118 or email accounts@elthamhs.vic.edu.au to arrange for the allocation to be processed.

Please ensure that if payment is made via CSEF, credit allocation or an alternate method to Compass, please ensure that you consent via Compass prior to the closing date once the allocation has been made or payment has been receipted by the school.

If you are having issues accessing Compass, please contact the school for assistance. Thank you for your support with this matter.

Year 7 and 8 Sport Classes

We are excited to again offer elective excursions for Year 7 and 8 Sport classes, commencing in Term 3. Places are limited, so please be sure to consent and pay as soon as possible, if wanting to take part.

Year 7 students can choose between a combination of Zumba and Pilates classes at the Eltham Leisure Centre, or professional basketball coaching provided by HoopCity Eltham.

Year 8 students have the option of dance lessons facilitated by The Edge Performers School, or the Skate & Spin excursion. The Skate & Spin excursion will be a combination of rollerblading at Skaters Roller Rink and Spin classes at Eltham Leisure Centre. The decision to alternate between these sessions is primarily driven by the availability of instructors at Skaters Roller Rink.

The events are currently available on Compass, with consent and payment required by Friday 23 June (the last week of Term 2). Places are limited and allocations will be based on a 'first in, best dressed' policy. Interested students should pay and consent as soon as possible. In the event there is insufficient interest in one of the options offered, anyone who has selected this option will be advised and payment received will be refunded.

Students who don't select an elective excursion option for Term 3 will remain at school to complete normal Sport classes.

Please note, students in the Volleyball Program aren't able to opt-in to these excursions, as they are required at school during Sport lessons to complete the Volleyball Program.

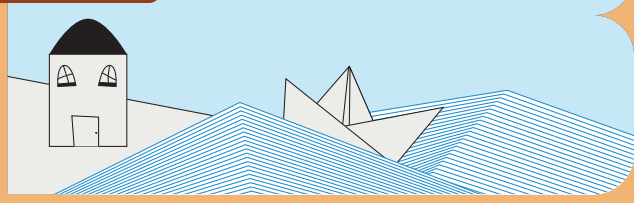
